APRIL SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

The Stated Meeting of Session was held on Monday, April 8, 2024 at 7:00 p.m. by Zoom. Present: Jay Abbey, Tim Bode, Phil Calland, Casey Craven, Lisa Miller, Candy Rinehart, Margaret Roark, Barb Yontz; Moderator, Rev. Jody Noble; Clerk of Session, Carol Miracle; Marty Fagans, Chairman of Trustees. Marty Billing was excused. Devotions and prayer were led by Pastor Jody.

Correspondence from the Presbytery acknowledged Covenant's gifts to the Christmas Joy Offering and Per Capita payments. The Presbytery reminded us that we need to adopt an Anti-Racism policy and conduct training every three years on Sexual Misconduct, Child Sexual Abuse, and Anti-Racism. We will be working on establishing a policy and setting up the required trainings. The Presbytery will be putting together a list of long-term (up to 3 months) pastor supply for sabbaticals and short-term disabilities.

Deacons will be meeting on April 21 at noon. The Covenant Children's Academy (CCA) Board met in March and reported that the Academy is doing well. They are taking applications for fall; enrollment is stable. There will be a one-week summer camp for 3-5 year olds at CCA in June.

The Treasurer's Report showed as of 2/29/24, 24.15% of the budgeted income has been received and 13.68% of the budgeted expenses have been incurred, leaving a surplus of \$53,936.20, a total inflated by carry over balance of approximately \$17,000 from 2023. \$354,277.30 remains available in the Building Improvement Fund for future projects. 85 pledge cards have been received totaling \$315.835.16. This is \$30,000 more than was pledged last year. The Investment Committee met with Park National Bank and will meet with Huntington Bank in April. At the May Session meeting, there will be a presentation on investments to the Elders. The Trustees reported that the pew cushions for the Chapel have been ordered and the \$7,600 cost was covered by Colony V. Trustees recommended and Session approved a bid from Advanced Business Communications to make the Fellowship Hall and main floor glass doors handicap accessible and operated by keypads for a cost of \$14,078.03. Volunteers are needed to help with the gardening, especially weeding. Quotes are being sought for re-glazing our leaded windows (not the stained glass). The windows have been neglected for decades and the project could be done over a 3-5 year time frame.

The Archive Room has been cleaned out. Pastor Jody will work with Kathleen Lauri-Lewis and Merydeth Tipton for 1.5 hours per week through June 6 on only paper items to determine what to keep, scan, shred, or recycle. The next steps will be presented to Session for approval. Session was asked to clarify the intent for the Registered Sex Offender Policy with regards to outside groups using the church property. Session determined that the policy was for everyone using the facilities; a representative of all outside groups will be given a copy of the policy. The church By-Laws (Code of Regulations) have not been updated since 2001. Margaret Roark and Jay Abbey volunteered to work with Pastor Jody to write a draft update. An Ad Hoc committee appointed by Session has been working to develop an instrument to be used for the Annual Pastoral Performance Appraisal. The performance appraisal will be completed by leaders of the congregation: Elders, Trustee Chair, Deacon Chair, Committee Chairs, and Staff. Questions will be based on the job description, objective ratings, and comments. All answers and comments will be confidential/anonymous. A committee will be appointed to review the results and share with the Pastor. Session voted to move its beginning meeting time from 7:00 p.m. to 6:30 p.m.

Session committees gave their reports. Marketing/Communication thanked Diane Van Auker for her many years of service as the chair and Tim Bode was welcomed as the new chair. The Worship Committee stated that new paraments have been ordered using money remaining from the donations for new Chancel vases. Church Membership reported that there will be a new member class on Sunday, May 19 and they are connecting with visitors. A spring all-church fellowship night featuring Bingo and snacks was well attended and enjoyed. A pancake breakfast hosted by Tom and Julie Slaughter on Sunday, March 17 was very successful. The Mission and Outreach Committee reported that the Ukrainian family has arrived and was honored along with our Haitian families at Treat Time on April 7. \$1,500 checks be sent to Sheltered, Inc. and Autumn Trails. Session approved the committee's name change from Mission Outreach to Mission. The Safety Committee has transferred its chair position from Candy Rinehart to Lisa Miller and thanked Candy Rinehart for her dedicated service. The Personnel Committee is revising the HR manual and the final document will be sent to Session for approval at their May meeting.

The meeting was closed with prayer. The next Stated Session meeting is Monday, May 13 at 6:30 on Zoom
