
Pastor's Note

Make a joyful noise to the LORD, all the earth.


Worship the LORD with gladness; come into his presence with singing (Psalm 100:1).

September Session Highlights

The Stated Meeting of Session was held on Monday, September 8, 2025 at 6:30 p.m. in the Session room. Present were Session members Jay Abbey, Cindy Baird, Phil Calland, Casey Craven, Lisa Miller, Candy Rinehart, Barb Yontz; Moderator Pastor Jody Noble; Clerk of Session, Carol Miracle; guests John Shanley, Treasurer, and Marty Fagans, Chair of Trustees; Rev. Bob Wade, Rev. Lynn Bova, Jim Griffin, representatives of the Miami Valley Presbytery. Elders Brent Dunlap and Margaret Roark were excused. Devotions were provided by Lisa Miller.

Session unanimously asked the Presbytery's Committee on Ministry to approve that Pastor Jody be moved from Designated to Installed Pastor and that it occur before the conclusion of the current Designated Pastor contract. The called Special Meeting of the Congregation for Sunday, October 12 will expand its business item of voting on the slate of officers for the Class of 2028 to include approving Pastor Jody's move from Designated Pastor to Installed Pastor with an installation service date to be determined by COM and Session.

The Statistical Report showed that as of August 31, 2025, Covenant had 247 Active, 262 Inactive, and 2 Associate members. Average attendance for Sunday morning services (including online) was 193.16. The Treasurer's Report showed as of 7/31/25, 48.70% of the budgeted income has been received and 52.28% of the budgeted expenses have been incurred, leaving a deficit of \$28,044.73. \$315,531.84 remain available in the Building Improvement Fund for future projects. The 2026 Church Operating Budget was approved unanimously. Session approved the bid to replace the Session room AC/Heat unit. The Stewardship Campaign will be held October 12 – November 16, 2025. There was discussion about replacing the leathers on the organ. Several companies will be contacted for estimates. Because of the age of the instrument, this work has been deemed necessary.

The baptism of Elijah Kalinowski, Carter Richwine, and Cyrus Richwine will be held on October 19. They are the children of Jackie Zinkhon and Jessie Zinkhon.

Deacons met in late summer to plan the Worship on the Farm for September 21. Their responsibilities included moving tables and 100 chairs from Fellowship Hall to the farm, transporting and setting up the clavinova and sound equipment, providing signage and parking assistance, bringing bottled water and chicken, taking care of trash and recycling, and returning items to the church. The Deacons will host a Hoe Down/Fall Fest on Saturday, October 25 from 6:00-8:00 p.m. There will be a professional caller, and the event is for families. Hanging of the Greens will occur on Monday, November 24 at 5:30 p.m. The Deacons have a new refrigerator for use in flower delivery and other parts of their mission. Donations are welcome to help with the cost.

Final plans for hosting the Presbytery on Tuesday, September 9 were gone over. Session thanks those who have volunteered to help with this large undertaking.

The Session Committees gave their reports. The Presbyterian Women's Horizons Bible Study will be launched on September 17 for Wednesday mornings from 10:00-11:00. This is a 10 week series. The study is open for both men and women. There are 24 signed up for this opportunity.

The children's space at the back of the sanctuary will be changing from a play space to a guided worship space with adults manning children's tables and sharing kids' bulletins following Sunday School topics. Reformation Sunday/Kirkin' o' the Tartans is scheduled for October 26. Marketing Committee will continue to manage the church website, social media presence, and other communications (newsletters email, Sunday bulletin, and ads). Mission Committee is sponsoring the meal packing for Lesotho on Saturday, September 13. The goal is to pack 15,000 meals. The Gifts of Hope and Promise Neighborhood sub-committees are meeting and planning for the upcoming holiday season. Mission was updated on Haitian support including help with rent and Walmart Cards issued. Membership Committee reported that a new member class and lunch was held on August 17, and Brad Soles and Ken White were received into membership. The next new member class is scheduled for November 9. United Senior Services will be providing help in establishing use of the pickleball courts. More to come on this soon. Personnel Committee recommended approval of an Amended Youth Ministry Specialist Job Description. Session approved. Missy Hawley is retiring from her position as Chair of Personnel after serving in that capacity for 10 years. Session expressed its gratitude to Missy for her many years of work on this committee.

The next Stated Session meeting is Monday, October 13 at 6:30 in the Session room.

The meeting was adjourned with prayer.
