### AUGUST SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

The Stated Meeting of Session was held on Monday, August 12, 2024 at 6:30 p.m. in the Session room. Present were Session members Jay Abbey, Phil Calland, Lisa Miller (via Facetime), Candy Rinehart, Margaret Roark, Barb Yontz; Moderator Pastor Jody Noble; Clerk of Session, Carol Miracle; guests Marty Fagans, Chairman of Trustees and Emma Shaffer, Noah's Corner Director. Tim Bode, Kay Steele, and Casey Craven were excused. Devotions were provided by Casey Craven and read by Session members.

Emma Shaffer was interviewed by Session and enthusiastically approved for membership at Covenant Presbyterian. Email votes to call a Congregational Meeting for July 28 to approve Kay Steele as an Elder to fill the unexpired term of Marty Billing and approve Pastor Jody Noble's Terms of Call for 2925; to install Kay Steele as Elder; and to baptize Ariana Joazard, and Brooke Rogers were added to the minutes. Deacons are meeting August 18, 2024 to plan the picnic on the farm and other fall events. CCA begins school on Wednesday, September 4. Enrollment is increasing, and the academy is looking for grants.

The Treasurer's Report showed as of 6/30/24, 51.19% of the budgeted income has been received and 46.51% of the budgeted expenses have been incurred, leaving a surplus of \$20,295.56, a total inflated by carry over balance from 2023. \$367,784.74 remain available in the Building Improvement Fund for future projects. There have been a total of 84 pledge cards received totaling \$315.835.16. The church continues to do well financially. Hal Goodrich sent a letter of resignation as church treasurer to be effective 12/31/24. He has served the church for the past 5 years. Session voted to receive his resignation with regrets and thanks for a job well done. John Shanley will begin serving as Covenant's treasurer beginning 1/1/25. Session did the first reading on the proposed budget for 2025. Second reading will occur in September.

The following Action Items were approved by Session:

From correspondence – a request from Springfield Medical Center Spiritual Health Department to use our facilities on December 12, 2024 from 5:00 – 7:00 p.m. for a Community Memorial Service.

Upon recommendation of the Trustees – appropriating \$3,850 for painting the associate pastor's office and the bathroom next to it. The project to replace doors and entrance keypads has been completed. The camera system that allows personnel in CCA (2 rooms), choir room, financial office, and the main office to admit members/visitors is outdated and not compatible with the new door system. Session approved the \$7,542.18 expenditure to replace the outdated system.

From Trustees - creating a money market account with Huntington Bank because Huntington's interest rates are significantly higher than those we are receiving currently.

From the Boy Scouts – chartering Cub Pack #20. Our Boy Scout Troop #1 has no feeder Cub pack. A cub troop currently housed at Grace Lutheran has requested to move its charter to Covenant. The troop has 6 adult leaders who have been with the pack and are seasoned leaders who have children in the program. #1 and #20 will meet simultaneously in close proximity.

From the Boy Scouts - to hold a popcorn sale at the church in November.

From the Safety Committee – a proposed change to the "Application for Use of Facilities" form. The words "I agree to safeguard the key(s), fob and/or codes issued to me, not to copy them, not to give them to anyone, and to return them to the Church Office immediately upon termination of need for it, or upon request by the Pastor or Facilities Manager. I also verify that I have received a copy of the Access Control Policy" are to be added along with a space for signature and date.

From the Safety Committee - a newly created "Church Access Request Form"

Upon recommendation of the Personnel Committee – items concerning employee benefits (education stipend, classifications, and changing wording to be consistent with the Book of Order). The recommendation concerning Payout of Vacation and Sick Benefits upon Separation of Employment was sent back to the Personnel Committee for review.

From the Christian Education Committee - A Proposed Christian Education Restructuring document was presented It was discussed and amended. It will go back to Education, then Personnel, and back to Session for final approval.

Reports were submitted that required no Session Action. Pastor Jody provided a Pastor's Report and a Study Leave Report. Marketing/Communication is working on a Marketing plan and hopes to present to Session soon. Covenant has taken out ads in both the Springfield Symphony and Arts Council program books. The name of Alternative Christmas Market has been changed to Gifts of Hope. Worship Committee is encouraging congregants to sign up on sheets outside the office to provide altar flowers and to host Treat Time. Worship at the Agle Farm will be Sunday, September 22 at 10:30. The Deacons will provide the protein course, and members will bring dishes to share for the picnic following the service. Worship is exploring participation in the Taize service program. The Mission Committee's primary focus for 2024 is Housing, Food, Health, Accessibility and Equality. \$1,500 checks have been delivered to Freedom School, Sheltered Inc., and Autumn Trails. Three more \$1,500 checks will be delivered to On the Rise, Open Hands Free Pantry, and Jefferson St. Oasis Garden. The Ukrainian family children went to Kirkmont for camp. \$1,400+ was received from the rummage sale for the Mission Trip to Kirkmont. Water Step at Northminster Presbyterian Church will be collecting gently used shoes the last 2 Saturdays in August. Membership Committee reports that there will be a New Member Class on Sunday, August 18 at noon with lunch provided.

The next Stated Session meeting is Monday, September 9 at 6:30 in the Session room. A called meeting will be Monday, August 26 at 6:30 on Zoom.

The meeting was adjourned with the prayer.
