Note and Question from the Worship Committee

Rev. Michelle Boomgaard, Pastor of Christ Episcopal Church, spoke with the Worship Committee inviting Covenant to consider hosting a community Taize service in 2025.

What is a Taize service? Taize is prayer for all Christian faiths. It is a simple meditative form of worship, calling us to dwell on Christ's presence around and within us. Simple repeating songs like "Jesus Remember Me," prayerful silence, and short readings guide the focus of prayer in a candlelit environment.

A host church develops its Taize service of contemplation (with many online resources available) held on a late Sunday afternoon followed by a light meal or potluck.

First Baptist hosted a Taize service in February 2024 and Christ Episcopal will host one in October of 2024. In order to present a request to Session to include a Taize service in our 2025 worship calendar, we need a small group of Covenanters willing to share their time and talents to plan and host the service, and the following light meal, to talk to Susan Hawkins (SJHawkins48@gmail.com) or Pastor Jody (Fire2Last@aol.com). MARCH SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

The Stated Meeting of Session was held on Monday, March 11, 2024 at 7:00 p.m. by Zoom. Present were Session members Jay Abbey, Tim Bode, Phil Calland, Casey Craven, Lisa Miller, Candy Rinehart, Margaret Roark, Barb Yontz; Moderator Pastor Jody Noble; Clerk of Session, Carol Miracle; guest Marty Fagans, Chair of Trustees. Marty Billing was excused. Devotions and prayer were led by Margaret Roark.

The church welcomed two new members, Merydith Tipton and Raymond Romelius. Jack Spencer and Garth Robinson requested to be moved from the inactive to active roll. This gives Covenant 255 active members. \$600 was send to PCUSA for the Peacemaking Offering. The Treasurer's Report showed as of 1/31/24, 12.88% of the budgeted income has been received and 3.23% of the budgeted expenses have been incurred, leaving a surplus of \$50,518.62. This has been inflated by 2023 carry over balance. \$345,835.91 remain available in the Building Improvement Fund for future projects. There has been a total of 81 pledge cards received totaling \$336.550.62. The church is doing well financially. Session approved renewal of the organ service contract, repairs on the sprinkler system, and reorganization of the grounds committee. The Application for Use of Facilities was revised to include the statement, "Applications will not be approved if the event is for personal, organization, or business financial gain." Baptism was approved for Teagan (age 5) and Declan (age 2), children of Joe and Erin (Bader) Dempsey on Sunday, April 7, 2024 at the 10:30 worship service. The Archive Room Project was discussed, and the plan presented by Pastor Jody was affirmed by the Session. Commissioners to Presbytery will be Carol Miracle and Barb Yontz, May 14; Phil Calland, Lisa Miller, Carol Miracle, September 10; Margaret Roark and Jay Abbey, November 9. Session approved closing the church office on April 8. Clark County Health District has suggested staying off the roads that day due to the large influx of traffic for the total eclipse.

Session committees gave their reports. Christian Education reported that the Souper Bowl Sunday collection by the youth went to Enon Relief Pantry in memory of Charlot Wade. Marketing/ Communication is putting together a marketing plan. The Worship Committee report gave an update on the chapel pew cushions. An Ad Hoc Committee comprised of Susan Hawkins, Marty Fagans, Cynthia Nowka, Margaret Roark, Greg Veith, and Pastor Jody met to look at samples and make a recommendation for the \$7,500 allocated by Colony V. These committee members are representatives of Worship, Trustees, Colony V, Session, and Staff. The committee voted for the bid that included the selected fabric, zippers (for cleaning and pad replacement), diamond shaped tufting, and measuring done by the company. Because of shipping costs, the bid was \$173 over the money allotted by Colony V. Session approved using general funds money to cover this extra expense. It was announced that Kirkin of the Tartans will be October 27. New tartans are being purchased with money donated in memory of David Martin. The banners will hang in the chapel when not being used for Kirkin. Session

approved the Organ Use Protocol, as written. Mission/Outreach reported that the Ukrainian family is in Poland awaiting their flight to the US. They are expected to arrive in Columbus on the afternoon of March 13 and will be greeted by a small group with three large vehicles. They are hoping to be in church on Sunday, March 17 for a "soft" welcome. Church Membership reported that a spring all-church fellowship with Bingo and snacks will be held Wednesday, March 20 from 6:00-7:30 p.m. A pancake breakfast hosted by Tom and Julie Slaughter will be Sunday, March 17, 9:00 - 10:15. The Personnel Committee sent a revised job description for Pastor/Head of Staff. Session approved. There was a motion for a Session work group to create and implement an objective Pastor performance evaluation form and a process to receive input from church leadership, congregants, and staff; and that the Session will conduct the Pastor annual performance evaluation. Approved unanimously.

The next Stated Session meeting is Monday, April 8 at 7:00 p.m. on Zoom. The meeting was adjourned with prayer.
